Our vision: To find the cause of and a cure for brain tumours while improving the quality of life for those affected.

Annual Grant Opportunties

Studentships

Studentships provide \$10,000 over two years (\$5,000 per summer), allowing students to become more familiar with the brain tumour research field and its research methods.

Fellowships

Fellowships provide funding (\$100,000 over two years) to young researchers, helping them to start their careers in the important field of brain tumour research.

Youth Education Awards

Survivors of a pediatric brain tumour (diagnosed with a brain tumour before the age of 25), between the ages of 16 and 30, who are pursuing post-secondary education are eligible for this unique Brain Tumour Youth Education Award opportunity (up to \$5,000).

Research Grants

Grants of up to \$25,000 will be available for research taking place within Canada for any type of primary or metastatic brain tumour, adult or pediatric.

Current Research Initiatives

Brain Tumour Registry of Canada

The Brain Tumour Registry of Canada collects data from every tumour diagnosed, to better understand prevalence and survival rates for brain tumours, and get a better picture on who is affected, and any possible causes. It was officially launched in May 2019.

Brain Tumour Tissue Bank

To aid researchers, the Brain Tumour Tissue Bank provides brain tumour samples from patients and matches clinical data for neurooncology research conducted in Canada and around the world. The Brain Tumour Tissue Bank was founded in 1991 and is independently operated in the London Health Sciences Centre Univeristy Campus in London, Ontario.

Collaborative Grants

To further the impact of important brain tumour research, Brain Tumour Foundation of Canada works with other organizations to support and advance brain tumour research.
