LONDON, ON — **May 1, 2025**: May is both Brain Tumour Awareness Month (BTAM) and Vision Health Month. This year, Brain Tumour Foundation of Canada is proud to partner with FYidoctors to shine a light on the critical connection between vision changes and early brain tumour detection.

Together, the organizations are launching a national awareness campaign to educate Canadians about how routine eye exams can help identify early signs of brain tumours, including blurred vision, double vision, visual field loss, and abnormal eye movements.

"We're proud to partner with FYidoctors during Brain Tumour Awareness Month and Vision Health Month to highlight the critical connection between eye health and brain tumours. Through this partnership, we hope to empower Canadians with the knowledge they need to seek care sooner. Early detection saves lives, and it often starts with an eye exam," said Nicole Farrell, interim CEO of Brain Tumour Foundation of Canada.

Brain tumours can affect vision in subtle ways long before other symptoms appear. In some cases, an eye exam can detect signs such as swelling of the optic disc (*papilloedema*) or pressure on the optic nerve, leading to faster diagnosis and treatment.

Many people may not realize that optometrists can be the first health-care professionals to detect early warning signs, often prompting further testing that can lead to a life-saving diagnosis.

"We have been proud supporters of Brain Tumor Foundation of Canada for years now, and I am glad we are now working together to encourage Canadians to prioritize their health in this campaign for May", said Dr. Alan Ulsifer, Chair and CEO of FYihealth group, "Eye exams go beyond determining if someone needs glasses or not – it could literally save your life or help diagnose other underlying health issues that you may not be aware of."

The campaign will include in-clinic awareness materials, social media content, and educational resources highlighting symptoms, the importance of regular eye exams, and support services for Canadians affected by brain tumours.





With over 27 Canadians diagnosed with a brain tumour every day, early detection and awareness are critical.
