In these positions, she managed multi-million-dollar ministry-funded portfolios, strengthened accountability frameworks, and collaborated extensively with hospital and government partners on complex health system initiatives. Her work has consistently emphasized strategic clarity, operational excellence, and thoughtful partnership development.

Her educational background includes a Master of Business Administration with a specialization in management consulting, complemented by a postgraduate certificate in adult education, an academic combination that supports her balanced, systems-focused approach to leadership. In addition to her professional roles, Nicole has contributed her expertise through service on



nonprofit boards and advisory councils, bringing valuable governance and sector-wide perspective to her work.
